An update from Miss Marshall...

We are very proud to say that our new 'Rainbow Room' is up and running. The sensory space has been a tremendous hit with our children and staff alike! We have worked really hard to create a safe space for children to come to when the classroom or wider school environment proves challenging. If your child is currently on a Pupil Passport and Pupil Profile you will have recently or will shortly be receiving their updated paperwork which will include their updated targets and progress towards their individual outcomes – these will be shared with you ahead of parent/carer consultations.

If you have any concerns about your child's learning or wish to speak to the SENDCo, an appointment can be made via the school office.

School improvements/School Entrance and Exit

You will have noticed that the fence surrounding the school yard has disappeared – not stolen as some of the younger children suggest! It makes the place look so much more welcoming and a whole lot bigger. It has hopefully helped with funnelling the children up the path towards the exit and made exiting the site much easier which I'm pleased about.

The next stage will be to have the yard marked and the bike/scooter storage installed. There are plans to make a garden area in the quiet yard and install some planters – I am hoping that the rest of this stage of the work will be carried out at Easter if not before.

I really hope it improves the outdoor environment for the children and they get as good an experience outside of the classroom as they get in it.

School Uniform

While we are generally quite accommodating of children when they outgrow a pair of school shoes etc. I have noticed a number of children are consistently wearing trainers to school which is not in line with school uniform policy. Please can you ensure that proper school shoes are worn.





There is a significant amount of spare uniform in good condition and we can always support with cost if this is needed. Please speak to me if you require this or any of the office team.

I have also noticed a number of children have had their ears pierced and have been wearing tape/plasters to cover them. Please remember that children need to be able to remove them and wear plastic retainers for school. If there is not enough time for these to be put in, children should not have their ears pierced.

From now on, I will be asking for earrings to be removed as it is a health and safety risk, particularly for PE.

If you wish for your child's ears to be pierced, the Summer Holidays are the best time to allow them to heal sufficiently.

Activities/Trips etc

There are so many exciting activities and trips taking place. I am delighted that we will be taking Year 5 to London again this year and they will get to experience their capital city. It is a wonderful experience for the children and something that completely astounded last year's group. I feel it is so important for the children to see and do as much as possible and understand the impact they can have.

I am also delighted that Year 3 and 4 will be having their bush craft and sleepover experience on the school field. A specialist company will set up a tee-pee tent and the children will learn survival skills and camp out. It will be a fantastic experience and one that the children will never forget.

Both of these supports our children in achieving:

Confidence Resilience Independence

Three of the skills parents said they wished their child to leave school with during their time with us.

I am delighted that the Show Club and Mini-Movers have had a workshop with the Northern Ballet on Thursday – something completely new to the vast majority of them.

I am pleased that we have also had some entries from our Year 6 children in the Catenian Public Speaking competition. We have chosen a school winner and forwarded them to the BBCET competition – a trust wide set of entries.

Public speaking is a real skill and another thing all children will benefit from. There was a huge amount of hard work from our children and a real range of topics.





Well done to Ethan, Ava, Meghan and Evie from Year 6 who all wrote speeches and presented them to some classes in school. They were all about things they were passionate about. Our winner from school was Evie – whose recording of her speech was sent to the final panel on Wednesday Morning.

We'll keep our fingers crossed that we get through.
