# Spring whole school focus

This term, our whole school focus will be **Shaping Our World.** As we start 2024, our pupils will focus on those who have and who continue to work towards making the world a better place for us to live.

In PSHE, we will learn about our rights and responsibilities in the world we live in. As a school we will be celebrating Holocaust memorial day, looking at how the events of the Holocaust can teach us valuable lessons about how to make Earth a better place to live. In March, we will celebrate International Women's day, World water day and Fairtrade fortnight, studying inspirational people who inspire us to work together for the good of the planet. Our Aspire to Inspire focus this term is **Teamwork** and **Confidence.** Our faith focus will be **honesty.** We will celebrate pupils and classes who demonstrate these values.

# Increasing the length of the school day

Thank you to those of you who shared your opinions on this through the googleform which was sent out. We do value the opinions of all parents/carers. As previously stated, the DFE directive for all schools to increase the length of the school day to 32.5 hours is statutory. As from April 1<sup>st</sup> the school day will start at 8.45am.

Nursery hours will not change. If your child attends Nursery for 30 hours, they will continue to start at 8.30am and finish at 3.15pm.

The school gates will be open for Parents/Carers to bring their children onto the yard from 8.30am. Children will be brought into school ready to start at 8.45am. The school gates will be locked at 8.50am and reopened at 3.00pm.

#### <u>Clubs</u>

We will send out information about new clubs and signup details as soon as we can next week but they will include a range of art club and book and abiscuit. Information will be confirmed next week.





#### School improvement work

The children continue to enjoy the new playground and are certainly loving the installation of the new football posts on the lower yard. Mrs Poynton and her Eco committee planted trees at the front of the school at the end of the Autumn term and school meadow continues to thrive. We love that some of our children are working with Mrs Poynton and looking at ways for our school to be more environmentally friendly.

# Trips and events

During this half term, we have some lovely experiences organised for the pupils of St Aidan's:

On Friday 12<sup>th</sup> January the children will experience Virtual Reality exploring themes linked to their science topic. We have Rockpool workshops coming into school, allowing children to explore unique seaside habitat and how we can protect it. We have a live STEM Spaceship Earth live interactive show, exploring how Space science can help combat climate and change and STEM Robotics and coding workshops later this month.

Arrangements are being made for the Year 3 Camp out, Year 4 Kip on the Ship, Year 5 London Day trip and the Year 6 Robinwood residential. You will continue to find out more information about these in coming months and there will be a parent meeting for each.
