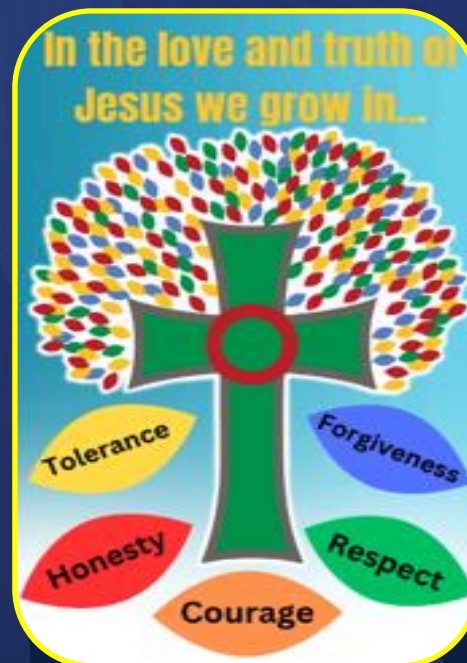
Our Stars this week were nominated for:
