Sycamores – We have worked hard in Geography learning about where we live. We have also made a great attempt at writing independently for an assessment in Literacy.

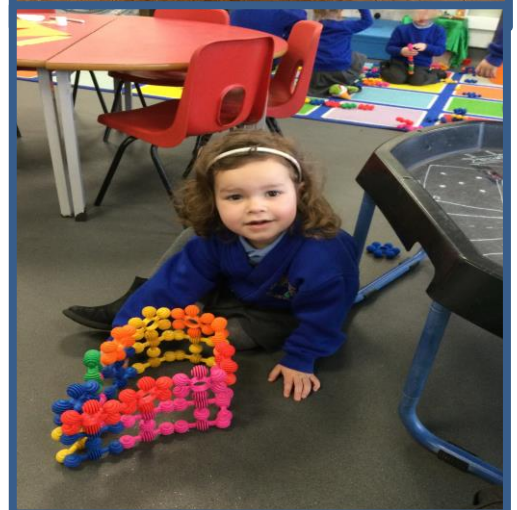
Poplars – We have made a fantastic start to our multiplication and division topic. Bring on those Times Tables!
