Year 6 have now finished their SATs assessments. They were more than prepared for them and have worked their socks off this year and gone about it in such a mature and determined manner. Mrs Teer left them well prepared to tackle anything and I have high expectations that they will achieve incredibly well.

Thank you to Mrs Burgess who made sure she provided a really good breakfast option each day.

I must also thank Mrs Teer for the work she has put in this year. She has seen such improvement in them all and they really have such a positive relationship with her.

School improvements

The yard markings have arrived and are currently sitting in yard of GMS – the grounds maintenance people who will be installing them. They need a period of consistent warmer and dry weather to install them but it should be within the next few weeks. I can't wait for the children to be able to have the games to play. One they're in, we're installing some metal goal/basketball rebounders to create a little pitch at the bottom of the yard.

I have just set the budget for the school next year and have set aside a significant amount of funding to rip out the old ICT suite and create a purpose-built library filled with fantastic new reading resources. It will be specifically designed to be inviting, comfortable and attractive to promote a love of reading with the children. Myself and Miss Givens are consulting with several companies and we have appointments booked for people to come and measure up soon. Hopefully we will have a fantastic new library ready for September, with work carried out over the holidays.

Our Prayer and Reflection space has also been officially blessed and opened by Fr Shaun. It is such a lovely space and has been paid for by fundraising from the school council a grant from the Mercy Project. The children love to come and sit in it during break and use it so





respectfully. A special thankyou to Mrs Shortt and Miss Givens who spent so much time sourcing and planting the flowers. We've decided to dedicate it to Mrs Leslie's Dad and brother who sadly passed away during her last couple of years as Headteacher. We've purchased a plaque and we'll share a liturgy with her the next time she comes to visit.

We are also drawing up plans to improve the outdoor provision in Nursery and Reception. Watch this space...
