

<u>Seedlings:</u> We have started our "Marvellous Me" topic and we have been exploring our names and drawing self portraits! <u>Saplings:</u> Saplings have been super this week! We have jumped straight into the new Phonics programme (I wonder if they can tell you the sounds they have learnt?)

Sycamores: We have had a super week in phonics applying a our knowledge of black cat sounds into CVC words to write captions.

<u>Poplars:</u> In Literacy this week we have been learning about verbs. WE have enjoyed playing games, our favourite was Simon says!

Maples: In RE this week, we have been looking at all what makes a loving home and how we show we have a loving heart. We have talked about how helping our parents with chores and sharing with siblings are little things that can make our homes a happy place.
